Are you looking for something different to do this summer?

Working as Camp Staff is a great way to meet other Scouts from around Arizona (and the country). Staff members have the opportunity to take merit badge classes at camp and earn the badges that they teach. Being a member of Camp Staff will get you out of the 120+ degree heat in Phoenix and into the beautiful forests of northern Arizona.

Almost all departments are looking for staff members and CITs at Camp Geronimo. To be a Youth Staff member, you need to be between 16 and 18. To be a Counselor-In-Training (CIT) you need to be between 14 and 15. Youth Staff are paid and CITs earn "Knappy Bucks." CITs work in two sessions (one session=half the summer). The CIT can work session one in one department and session two in another department, or may be able to work both sessions if desired in the same department. Many CITs just work session one or session two. Paid youth staff work from the end of May until the summer is over.

I have worked at Geronimo for the past two summers..It is a blast and I think other people would love it..As I mentioned, each department needs staff. Each department has a lot to offer staff and CITs (For example, Aquatics Staff and CITs have the opportunity to earn their BSA lifeguard certification. BSA Lifeguard is accepted by most public schools/YMCAs in order to become a lifeguard and is viewed as comparable to Red Cross Lifeguard training). I am the director of the Indian Lore side of the newly created "Outdoor Skills" lodge. Indian Lore needs one staff member and two CITs.

Please contact me asap, if interested in helping in Indian Lore or anywhere else.

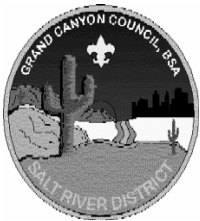
