Recruiting Ideas

The key to recruiting is visibility.

For Cub Packs there are many opportunities at your schools, outside the Meet the teacher Nights and Curriculum nights to be seen. Offer to raise the schools flag once a week. Have the kids bring their uniforms, do the ceremony, and then change into regular clothes for the normal day. Offer to do flag ceremonies at school assemblies. Ask to participate as a unit in the school's extra curricular activities like dances, ice cream socials or carnivals. Offer to serve food, etc. For troops, you can do the same at your schools. All units can be visible in their community by performing community service, holding some meetings at local parks, participating on parades (even as a vendor doing fund raising) Or taking their special meetings and activities outdoors, like having a Pinewood derby at a local shopping center or working on a merit badge with outdoor activities to local parking lot..

Training is important. It protects you and your scouts as well as introduces you to many things you might not have been aware of. Nothing beats the personal experience of our regular training programs, but if you can't make it to a scheduled class, there are some on-line resources. These courses are great for those bi-annual renewals. If you decide to try it on-line you need to let your District Training Chair know that you completed the on-line version of the program. Copy the card that the programs generally print at the end of the training. The Youth Protection program promises a card by email, but rarely follows. Only if you entered your Scout ID Number at the beginning of the program will it send the card. It doesn't tell you this and it leads you to believe that you will be getting it. Print the page that says "Congratulations, you passed". Bring this page to the next Roundtable.
